Mohan Toopal

As Mohan likes to say, he wasn't born with a paintbrush in his hand, but with springs in his feet. A lifelong athlete, he traveled the world competing in Grand Prix track events while pursuing a degree in engineering. Painting entered his life by accident in 2010. Although he stepped away from it between 2012 and 2017, creativity eventually pulled him back in.

Mohan is drawn to painting the human form shaped by light. Beginning with watercolors, he later explored acrylics and ultimately found his way to oils. His watercolor roots still shine through in his oil paintings: loose, suggestive, intentionally vague in places, yet clear where it matters. He has also experimented with gouache, achieving beautifully abstract effects.

His work blends realism with abstraction, and his recent pieces reflect this shift. Mohan's brushstrokes are broad, spontaneous, and purposeful—creating a sense of freedom while offering just enough detail. He hopes paintings invite the viewer to interpret, rather than merely observe.

True to his engineering background, Mohan approaches each painting with a clear vision of the end result. And as we see the end results certainly invite us to immerse ourselves in his vision. There is beauty in his subtle shift from dream to reality.

Since retiring, he has expanded his creative pursuits to include leathercraft, adding yet another dimension to his artistic journey



GVAL OUTREACH




